**CURRENT DEAN OF LAW AT WAYNE STATE AND
BESTSELLING AUTHOR FRANK WU ON THE TOPIC OF
"DIVERSITY AND HOW TO ACHIEVE IT ON CAMPUS AND IN
THE COMMUNITY"**



Dean Wu graduated with a J.D. from the University of Michigan. He has taught at Columbia and Howard, and is currently the Law Dean at Wayne State. He served on the DC Court of Appeals Board of Professional Responsibility and Leadership Conference on Civil Rights Education Fund. He was also Chair of the D.C. Human Rights Commission. He is the co-chair of the Board of Trustees for Gallaudet University, the nation's only university primarily for the deaf and hearing-impaired. Dean Wu recently testified at the trial for the U of M Affirmative Action Case. He has appeared on CNN, NPR, Voice of America, as well as hosted the PBS Series "Asian America". He has written the book Yellow: race in American beyond Black and White, and co-authored Race, Rights, and Reparation: Law and the Japanese American Internship. Dean Wu was named one of 20 national scholars in "Black Issues in Higher Education", appeared on the list of "40 under 40" in "Crain's Detroit Business", and was chosen by the National Asian Pacific American Bar Association as one of the best lawyers under 40.
