1. Have we met the objectives of the Leadership Summit?

2. What are the most valuable portions of today’s program? And the least valuable?

Valuable:

- P.M. session. Exchange with other organizations most productive
- Speaker presentations
- Free flow of ideas, open environment
- For students able to create connections

Least Valuable:

- Group introductions
- Time taken to explain programs and projects

3. Your suggestions to follow up on today’s summit and to improve future Leadership Summits.

- Advance sharing of data via web/email.
- Reduce report outs to 2 or 3 key items
- Pre-distribute handouts to the leaders of the group, eliminate own organization discussion, move to discussion before the summit and bring results.
- Breakout groups should be topic specific: e.g. Health-care, Education etc.
- Create a directory with phone numbers and links to the organizations on the CAPA website
- Create a calendar of events

- Put out contact info of all attendees
- Improve information in invitation to make it more attractive
- More summits with different themes
- Do more promotion with students and young professionals
- Updates via email on some major actions proposed by each table in the next 12 months.

Next Summit:

- Follow up summit viewing the outcome of discussions. Evaluate projects that promoted Michigan revitalization.
- Collaborate with other organizations and report back as “took action.”
